The Telecommunication Development Bureau (BDT) is responsible for the organization and coordination of the work of the Telecommunication Development Sector (ITU-D) of the Union which deals mainly with ICT-focused development policies, strategies and programmes, as well as technical cooperation activities, to promote digital inclusion and drive digital transformation at community, country and regional levels. To effectively and efficiently serve the needs of ITU members, BDT is organized into four functional areas:

- Office of the Deputy to the Director and Field Operations Coordination Department
- Partnerships for Digital Development Department
- Digital Networks & Society Department
- Digital Knowledge Hub Department

## **Organization Unit:**

The Partnerships for Digital Development Department is responsible for the development of sustainable and impactful partnerships with donors, foundations, and the private sector. It further coordinates the delivery of these resources to meet the needs of the membership in accordance with World Telecommunication Development Conference (WTDC) and ITU Plenipotentiary Conference (PP) outcomes. This department is also responsible for project design and support, and contributes actively to the implementation of the regional initiatives. Finally, this department is

charged with defining the BDT membership strategy and for the sound management of the ICT Development Fund.

# Duties / Responsibilities



Under the supervision of the Chief, Partnerships for Digital Development Department (PDD), the Senior Advisor Resource Mobilization and Stakeholder Engagement will provide expertise for all assigned responsibilities to deliver expected outputs. The incumbent will perform the following duties:

- Lead the development and the implementation of a resource mobilization and partnerships strategy for the BDT to raise and mobilize resources and build partnerships to support the achievement of the World Telecommunication Development Conference objectives.
- Identify, recommend and oversee innovative methodologies and approaches and highlight fundraising opportunities to senior management in order to maintain and increase funding from new and traditional donors.
- Work closely with cluster leads, departments and regional offices; provide technical, policy
  and strategic advice to increase voluntary contributions by providing timely and strategic
  intelligence on issues, trends and opportunities for partnership development to enable
  informed decision making and actions planning; develop and coordinate a Bureau-wide
  resource mobilization network.
- Establish and promote quality standards and work processes for managing and deepening
  relationships with Sector Members, and build staff capacity, as needed to achieve increased
  Member satisfaction and engagement; oversee periodic reviews of current resource
  mobilisation and partnership building capabilities and practices, to ensure that ITU
  resource mobilization, partnership building and membership management strategies and
  activities are in line with the WTDC objectives.
- Guide and facilitate the proposal development work process within BDT's Resource Management Framework to ensure compliance with internal review and clearance procedures, and delivery of high-quality proposals to targeted funders.
- Provide technical guidance on effective resource mobilization and funding approaches and build capacity of staff in Regional and Area offices to strengthen BDT's resource mobilization culture and capacity at both in the field and headquarters.
- Monitor and oversee quality and timeliness of donor reporting across BDT, and advise BDT Director and other Senior Management, as appropriate, on required and aspirational funding levels.
- Participate and provide expert opinion at high-level international events, meetings, negotiation of agreements, policy discussions with partners and stakeholders, as delegated.
- Build, maintain and expand networks with key officials from donor agencies, promoting new ideas and opportunities for engagement and ensuring an on-going policy dialogue on relations with other UN organizations, and with other public and private sector stakeholders.
- Perform other related duties as assigned.

# Competencies

# Qualifications required

### **Education:**

Advanced university degree in business management, international relations, telecommunications or a related field OR education from a reputed college of advanced education with a diploma of equivalent standard to that of an advanced university degree in one of the fields above. For internal candidates, a first university degree in one of the fields above in combination with fifteen years of qualifying experience may be accepted in lieu of an advanced university for promotion or rotation purposes.

# Experience:

At least ten years of progressively responsible experience in the development and implementation of resource mobilization, partnership building and fundraising, including at least five at the international level. A Doctorate in a related field can be considered as a substitute for three years of working experience. Proven long-term experience in the development and implementation of resource mobilization and partnership strategies. Proven experience in donor mapping and research. Proven experience in fundraising. Experience should include demonstrated evidence of a successful track record in resource mobilization and fund raising.

### Languages:

Knowledge of one of the six official languages of the Union (Arabic, Chinese, English, French, Russian, Spanish) at advanced level and knowledge of a second official language at intermediate level. Knowledge of a third official language would be an advantage. (Under the provision of Resolution No. 626 of the Council, a relaxation of the language requirements may be authorized in the case of candidates from developing countries: when candidates from such countries possess a thorough knowledge of one of the official languages of the Union, their applications may be taken into consideration.)
